Volunteer at Limahuli Garden and Preserve Groups will help with removal of intrusive species and with other conservation efforts.

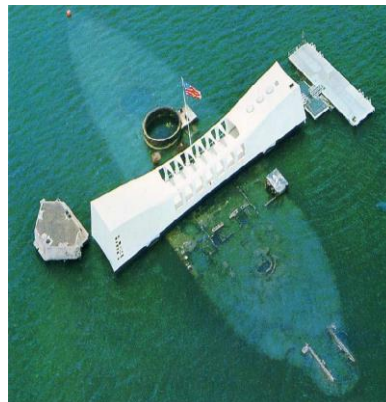


Trip Highlights:

Explore Waikiki Beach and the Banyan Trees



Tour Pearl Harbor
